## The “Well of Our Well-Being”

*“But whoever drinks of the water that I will give him shall never thirst; but the water that I will give him will become in him a well of water springing up to eternal life.” John 4:14*

I read recently that in the Australian outback, cattle are kept on a ranch by either building a fence around the perimeter of the land or building a well in the center. I assume the theory behind building the well is that the cattle will stay nearby and not wander off because they need the water. The well of water keeps them close.

### Our Well that Keeps Us Close

As Christians, what keeps us close to God is realizing (as Jesus taught the woman at the well in John 4) that He is the eternal well of truth and life that sustains our souls. He has and is “living water” which refers to flowing and running water like a stream or river. As a metaphor this reminds us that in our thirst for salvation and the life God created for us we draw from the well that moves into our lives with His living water of hope and help. When we are tempted to wander away into sin or rebellion; when we stray away from His purposes and work in our lives; when we face the dry and dusty “desert” of a weak faith; it is the well of Jesus that draws us back.

### Fences Don’t Work as Well as the Well!

The illusion we can live in is that we will stay close to Jesus if we have lots of fences of “do’s and don’ts” or “barbed wire” friends or family that will poke us into submission and try and prod us to stay close. However, what will truly satisfy us spiritually, draw us into obedience and press us closer to Jesus, is the deep drinking of His living water!

### Finding the Well

When Jesus talked to the woman at the well, she was puzzled. How can she have water that never dried up? How could she have water for her soul? Jesus made it clear that He alone would satisfy her ultimate thirst. So Jesus pointed to Himself as the living water. Thus we are reminded to turn to Jesus in prayer, being in His Word, in worship and Christian fellowship and in memorizing His Word as the way to the well that alone slackens our spiritual thirst.

### Our Desperation for the Water in the Desert

We have endured a significant heat wave in Boise recently. Being in a high desert place this is not unusual. That heat and dryness can certainly make us thirsty for water. And how good it tastes on those hot days! As we face the “heat waves” of life - from disasters to disease, from dry spiritual days to the dust of our failures and sin, to questions and concerns that try our souls, how good it is to be drawn back to the well of the refreshing and life-giving water of our Savior! What joy to drink long and deep of the love, hope, help and strength of our Savior!

### Our “Well” Being Is in Jesus

Jesus has dug the well. Jesus is the well. Jesus watches us and wonders, “why are you panting in that desert? Why are you looking to the fences when you can be looking to Me? After all, did I not say, ‘come to Me’?” Indeed beloved, the next time you reach for that glass of water on that hot day, remember Jesus as our living water. Remember the “well of our well-being” that keeps us. Remember Jesus!

-Psalm 148:1 *"PRAISE the LORD! Praise the LORD from the heavens; Praise Him in the heights!"*

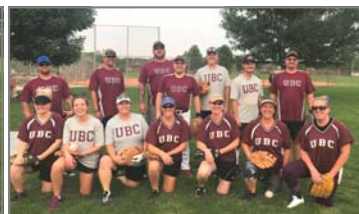
-Psalm 149:1 *"PRAISE the LORD! Sing to the LORD a new song, and His praise in the congregation..."*

July was a great month in Blaze youth ministry. Our summer schedule is a nice change of pace from our school year program. Though I am already looking forward to the fall, I am still excited for all that we get to do in the summer. This past month we had:

- ◇ a great movie night
- ◇ an incredibly fun time of playing "Slip 'n Slide Kickball"
- ◇ and last night we played hockey til we were exhausted and talked about the importance of giving God our attention because He is due it and because it's good for us to do so

For me, a highlight in July was spending six days in Ensenada Mexico at the Embrace Missions Camp with Agua Viva Ministries. The camp had roughly 150 people in attendance, many from parts of the United States and many from parts of Mexico. We came together with one purpose in mind, to proclaim Jesus Christ by serving Ensenada. Those 150 people broke up into nine teams with each team performing a different job. Some teams were construction teams, others were VBS teams, some were evangelism teams, and a lot more. My team was the Red Team and we were the team ministering to special needs adults and engaging in hospital evangelism. This was cool because we got to see the same group of adults each day and build on each previous day. We would meet them at their therapy center and sing worship songs, tell Bible stories, and talk to them about life. It was a lot of fun, especially on the last day when we brought them to Rancho Agua Viva (our base camp) and gave them a field trip with soccer, baseball and time in the pool. They loved it, so did we.



The hospitals in Ensenada reminded me more of a DMV in the ghetto. Every seat was filled, people were sitting on the floor and outside in the courtyard, obviously in pain or ill. We played worship songs in the courtyard and passed out sandwiches (we ran out fast each day because people were so hungry) and prayed with those that were sick and with their families. They were especially grateful and many perked up after we prayed with them. It was a humbling sight, no doubt.

Elizabeth and Kimberly Delie also went and were on the Pink Team serving with VBS and Rehab Centers. They'd love to tell you their positive experience, as well.

#### 4500 Kid-Hours!

Wednesday morning (VBS week), while trying to pry open my sleepy eyes with yet another cup of coffee, my husband had the nerve to say, "You get 900 more kid-hours today." Despite my wanting to pour my coffee on him I had to admit that the prospect was exciting when put like that. There were literally going to be 900-kid hours that morning (3 hours x 300 kids), 900 kid-hours to share God's love and forgiveness in one morning. It doesn't get much better than that!

Honestly though, **UBC really needs some Sunday morning volunteers**. I'm going to plead with you all about volunteer needs. Here is the reality:

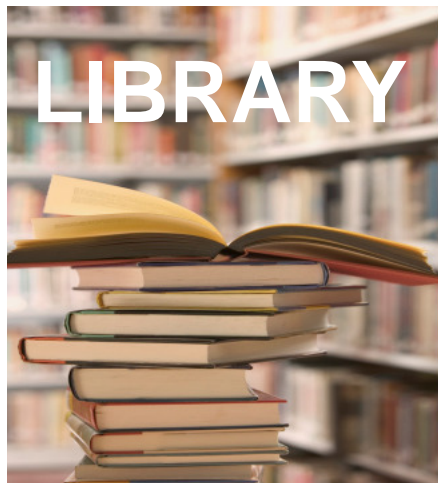

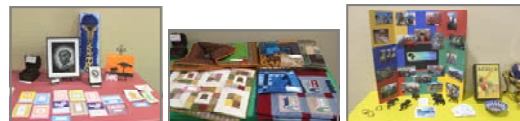
