What Hath God Wrought?

Reading Nehemiah 6:15-19

Opening Questions

1. Share something God has accomplished in your life (besides salvation) that you stand amazed by (e.g. a sin overcome, a blessing “beyond belief”, an event you never thought possible, “fruit” of serving the Lord you never expected, etc.)
2. What is the longest thing you have ever waited for?
3. In what ways do you try to express “giving credit” to God?

Study

1. What made accomplishing the work of rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem so difficult? cf. 2:12-15; 17; 2:10 with 4:1-3 and 6:17-19, etc.
2. Why is it amazing that the wall was done in 52 days? cf. 6:15
3. What is the significance of the enemies and the nations “losing confidence” in 6:16?
4. What is the key insight about how the work was “wrought” in 6:16?

5. In what ways has Nehemiah given credit to the Lord for His work in our study so far? cf. 2:18, 20; 4:14

6. How are we to understand the phrase “with the help of our God” in 6:16? In what ways do we fit into (participate in) the work of the Lord? In what ways can we overstate our work versus God’s? cf. John 15:5; Matt. 5:16; Deut. 8:10, 12-18; Psalm 127:1

7. How do we (can we) express praise/worship to God for the things He has “wrought”? cf. Psalm 145:2-5; Eph. 3:20-21

8. Give an example of something you have recently thanked and praised God for that He has “wrought” in your life or in life of those close to you.

9. In what way is Jesus the “greatest example and evidence” of what God has “wrought” in our world”

Application

1. Take time this month (with Thanksgiving) to rehearse with your family what “God hath wrought” and give Him praise!
