ELDERS CORNER

As we observe Holy Week this week, I'm reminded of Pastor Greg's admonition to us that "last words are lasting words." To that end, I was thinking about some of Jesus' last words to the disciples before His death on Good Friday and His resurrection on Easter Sunday. In my Bible, these are red-letter words, highlighting their importance since they are spoken by our Savior.

In John 17:21-23, Jesus asks the Father to hear Him on behalf of His believers "that they may all be one; even as You, Father, are in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, so that the world may believe that You sent Me. The glory which You have given Me, I have given to them, that they may be one, just as We are one. I in them and You in Me, that they may be perfected in unity, so that the world may know that You sent Me and loved them, even as You have loved Me."

Just as Jesus desires the unity of believers with the Father and Himself, so we as Elders desire unity within the body as it is a witness to the world around us and brings glory to God. With these things in mind, and through the effective prayers of our congregation these past months, the Elders have prayed and considered the needs of our multi-generational church for many months as we consider moving forward with a transitional pastor, our COVID protocols, and other needs. We also seek as much consensus within the Elder group as possible, and believe God is leading us forward in the following ways.

Transition Pastor

The Elders are recommending we hire a Transitional Pastor and call Mike Jacobson to fill this role. As mentioned previously, we believe more time will be beneficial for our church to transition to what God has in store for us, and this gives us the necessary time to see how God plans to lead us through this process. Mike's role would be to lead our church, our staff, provide staff mentoring support and help the Elders with specific projects to set our church up for success with our next Lead Pastor. We plan to send you more information and biographical detail about Mike's qualifications and experience by email in the next week or so.

We have some plans and key dates to give you opportunity to ask questions and vote to move forward. We have asked Mike to preach again on April 11 and kick off our sermon series after Easter in Philippians. After the second service that day, the Elders will host a question-and-answer session to give anyone the opportunity to ask questions and gain better understanding of how we are planning to proceed with this and other topics of interest to anyone who would like to attend. We plan to host this session on Zoom so those not attending that day can still log on and ask questions. More information will be coming about how to join us that way.

Our constitution makes provision for a congregational meeting in May each year. We would like to move that meeting up to **April 18 at 6pm**, to give you the opportunity to vote on this and other proposals:

- 1. Shall we amend our church constitution to allow for the use of digital and online voting for congregational meetings and decision-making?
- 2. Shall the church hire a transitional pastor?
- 3. If the church votes to hire a transitional pastor, shall the church call Mike Jacobson to fill this role?
- 4. We will vote on new members (if ready to do so)
- 5. We will vote to approve Deacons, Deaconesses and Trustees for new terms of service

The congregational meeting will also be held over Zoom to allow for online comments and voting.

COVID Protocols Exit Plan

Our original goal of installing COVID protocols included helping protect our most vulnerable population, showing love for each other by trying to help protect each other, and respecting the guidance of those in authority. The Elders have heard your thoughts, considered the plans for the vaccine rollout and agreed on how to move forward winding down our protocols. Major points of consideration include trusting that God is leading us in this way, recognizing that everyone has differing views on what is appropriate, understanding that a sizeable portion of our church population has access to the vaccine, that as a multi-generational church we must allow for younger families to have vaccine access, and have more opportunities for relationship building and spiritual edification. To that end, here is our plan:

- Distancing protocols are relaxed, effective immediately.
 Allowances for wearing face coverings can be made for
- non-Sunday small group meetings, including committee meetings and mid-week small group Bible studies held in the church building. The leader of the group may allow for meeting without masks as long as all in the group agree to do so, effective immediately.
- 3. Given that Idaho has moved vaccine availability up to the week of April 5 for anyone ages 16 and up, and allowing time for the vaccine to have its effect, we plan to remove all COVID protocol restrictions on Mother's Day, May 9, as long as infection rates remain favorable. This date is subject to change if community spread increases or for similar reasons. Those not comfortable with this plan may still worship with us online and make their own personal decision on when they feel comfortable attending.

The Elders would like to thank you for understanding the need to diligently seek God's leading in this area and being patient as we navigate this situation. Also, your prayers have been heard by God and are effective, and we are humbled to serve a church body that continues to seek the Lord in all these things.

Good Friday

As is our tradition, we will worship God and thank Him for His provision of Jesus as our Redeemer and Savior on Good **Friday**, **April 2** at 7pm. At this service, we will remember our Lord's sacrifice as we celebrate communion together at this service. Since we will share communion on Good Friday, we will not serve communion on Easter Sunday. After the service, the Elders will have a time for prayer, and we invite the congregation to pray with us. Please plan on joining us.

Easter (Resurrection) Sunday

We encourage you to pick up the colorful flyers on the tables near the church entrances and hand them to friends or someone you would like to invite to church as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ Sunday, April 4.

Bible Study

There are several Bible studies available to help you grow in your knowledge and understanding of God and your Christian walk with the Lord. We encourage you to join a study to grow in faith and in fervent love for one another (Romans 12: 9-13). A new ACE study led by Art Beauchene on the book of Jonah starts Sunday, April 11 and will be held Sundays during first service through May. There are currently separate Bible studies for women's and men's groups, along with those taking place in our Growth Groups. We encourage to you plug in to the power that comes from reading and studying God's Word with each other.

Save the date for **Summer Camp, June 27-July 1**. We'll be at Faith Heights in Donnelly, ID. Sign up and more details will be available soon.






